**ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH INTERIM INDUSTRIAL DISCHARGE WASTE WATER
RATES FOR PEARL VALLEY CHEESE**

WHEREAS, the Village of West Lafayette, Ohio is willing and able to receive and treat industrial discharge waste water from Pearl Valley Cheese and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of West Lafayette, State of Ohio as follows:

SECTION I. The Village of West Lafayette, Ohio will receive and treat industrial discharge waste water which complies with State and Federal Environmental Protection rules and regulations together with all other local State and Federal regulations and which is in accordance with the Village of West Lafayette, Ohio's permit.

SECTION II. The Village of West Lafayette, Ohio will have no responsibility for the delivery system which will be connected to the Village's lines at the intersection of State Route 93 and U.S. 36.


SECTION III. The Village of West Lafayette, Ohio will charge a fee, for receipt and treatment of the industrial discharge waste water, of Two and 75/100 (\$2.75) Dollars per each thousand (1,000) gallons of industrial discharge waste water received and treated as reflected by a master meter. This rate is only effective from January 1st, 2011 thru March 31st, 2011. The Coshocton County Commissioners will pay the fees generated by the industrial discharge waste water flow every month. The master meter will be provided, maintained and calibrated by others in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications. The Village of West Lafayette, Ohio reserves the right to terminate service for non-payment of service and to charge a reconnect fee.

SECTION IV. It is understood that the rate above will only apply to Pearl Valley Cheese Company for the time period specified above. In the event, the above rates do not cover all of the Village's expenses during this time period; the Village reserves the right to negotiate additional fees to cover said costs.

SECTION V. This ordinance does not change any of the terms or conditions as stated by Ordinance 2009-23 except those stated above.

SECTION VI. That this Ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for reason that Pearl Valley Cheese Company wishes to send industrial discharge waste water to the Village early January, 2011, and therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon passage, signing by the Mayor, and posting.
