Minutes of West Lafayette Village Council Regular Meeting

West Lafayette Village Council met in regular session on August 5, 2013 at 7:00 P.M., in the municipal building with Mayor Jack L. Patterson presiding.

Citizens' comments - Resident Steve Bailey spoke his concerns with councils' proposal of increasing residents' property taxes to support the 4 mill increase on the current levy. He had several questions relating to the police department's budget. His questions led to other questions for council to consider. What will council do if this doesn't pass? What things has the council done to help the situation? How can we cut costs in other ways? These are all questions that will need to be addressed. The Mayor made clear how he feels the council is making the right decision and allowing this to be placed on the ballot and letting the people make the final decision on the importance of our police department in this village. Reports:

Village Administrator: Dave wanted to "Thank" Annin Flag Company for donating the new flag poles and brackets on Main Street. Dave reported that the storm drain project on Kirk and Union will be finished by the end of August. Dave also reported that the garage door on the storage building had been replaced but now we have noticed a sizeable leak from the roof. Dave will get a few quotes on replacing the roof on this building and report back.

Police: Chief expressed his concerns about the traffic leaving the Buckeye Beverage Barn. It is difficult for drivers to see safely enough to turn onto Kirk Street from the alley. He would like to see a left turn only sign placed in the alley exiting the drive thru. The Mayor and Council agreed and Dave said he will get a no right turn sign in place. Therefore all traffic leaving the drive thru must turn left. However, thru traffic coming from SR 93 may continue to travel eastbound and exit onto Kirk Street. This is to help with the additional flow of traffic generated from the drive thru.
