AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 2020-73 TO MODIFY THE TERMS OF THE DONATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$10,000.00 TO THE RIDGEWOOD LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, SAID SUM FROM THE LOCAL CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on October 12, 2020, the Council for the Village of West Lafayette passed Ordinance No. 2020-73, titled "An Ordinance Authorizing A Donation In The Amount Of \$10,000.00 To The Ridgewood Local School District, Said Sum From The Local Coronavirus Relief Fund, Authorizing The Mayor And Fiscal Officer To Enter Into A Subgrant Agreement With The Ridgewood Local School District, And Declaring An Emergency;"

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2020-73 authorized a donation in the amount of \$10,000.00 to the Ridgewood Local School District for the purchase of additional student computers (Chromebooks) and related software, licenses, and warranties to support the need for remote learning during the 2020-2021 school year caused by the COVID-19 public health emergency (the "Chromebooks");

WHEREAS, after passage of Ordinance No. 2020-73, the Ridgewood Local School District requested that the Village allow the School District to use all or part of the donation for costs to upgrade the HVAC systems in School District buildings, such upgrades which may include the purchase and installation of air cleaning systems, Synexis technology, and/or other technology such as ultraviolet light technology and other air purifier technology or sanitation products, to aid in protecting School District students and staff from the virus that causes COVID-19 (the "HVAC Upgrades");

WHEREAS, the Village is agreeable to allowing the School District to use all or part of the donation for the purchase and installation of HVAC Upgrades for the School District building(s), as well as for the purchase of additional student Chromebooks; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, Ordinance No. 2020-73 and the terms of the subgrant agreement to be entered into with the School District should therefore be modified and/or amended.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WEST LAFAYETTE:

SECTION 1. Village of West Lafayette Resolution No. 2020-73 is hereby modified and/or amended as follows: A donation shall be made in the amount of \$10,000.00 to the Ridgewood Local School District for HVAC Upgrades (defined above) and/or for the purchase of additional student Chromebooks (defined above), provided that the School District accounts for the donation and spends the money received only on allowable and permitted uses by the CARES Act and the Ohio Office of Budget and Management.

SECTION 2. As set forth in Ordinance No. 2020-73, the donation is authorized to be expended from the federal Cares Act funding that the Village has received. The donation will be received by the School District as federal funds passed through from the Village of West Lafayette

which requires the Village to monitor how the funds are received and expended. The School District shall spend the donated funds no later than November 10, 2020, and any unspent funds shall be returned to the Village of West Lafayette by November 10, 2020. The School District shall provide supporting documentation of all expenses paid from said donation no later than December 20, 2020.

SECTION 3. The Mayor and Fiscal Officer are authorized to execute the Subgrant Agreement attached hereto for the donation to the School District. The Village Solicitor is authorized to make any necessary changes or modifications of the Agreement prior to execution of the Agreement by the parties. The Village Fiscal Officer is authorized to make any accounting changes or modifications associated with this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Village of West Lafayette, such emergency arising out of the immediate need for the passage of this legislation to be in compliance with the CARES Act and to ensure the timely distribution of funds within the permitted period of time, such that this Ordinance should take effect and be in force immediately from and after its passage.
