The contractor, Tucson Construction, is ready to start the last phase of the water line replacement project. Starting 2/22/21 they will begin interconnecting the old piping system to the new piping system.

To interconnect the two systems, the old system will need to be completely shut off. It may take up to two weeks to complete all of the interconnections. Each day the water will be shut off around 7:30 AM. The goal will be to have the water service back on by 4 PM. During this time 7:30 AM to 4 PM (est.) you will have no water.

To minimize having no water, the City is recommending you fill several clean containers with cold water and place in your refrigerator for drinking. Also, fill several containers with water for flushing your toilets.

Once the water service is returned to service at the end of the day you will most likely experience cloudy or discolored water. Because of this the City is issuing a Boil Advisory until the interconnections are done. You will be notified when the Boil Advisory is over. To help clear up the discolored water you may want to leave a cold-water faucet running a small (1/4 inch or less) stream of water.

BOIL ADVISORY

Do to the possibility of unsafe water, you are directed to immediately start **BOILING ALL DRINKING WATER taken from the public water system. This includes water for drinking, making ice cubes, washing foods, brushing teeth, or any other activity involving consumption of water.**

Water Should be brought to a full, rolling boil for at least 5 minutes to ensure that it is safe for consumption. Boiled water may be stored at room temperature or refrigerated in a closed container until needed.

This order shall remain in effect until further notice.
