Department Reports:

Fire: No report.

Fiscal Officer: Fiscal Officer, Amy Bourne, reported that Ordinance 2023-54 will receive its third and final reading with updates to the income tax code for the Village. Ordinance 2023-55 regarding dilapidated structures is updated to remove old "600" codes and will receive its second reading. Ordinance 2023-56 is to establish the 2024 pay and benefit schedule for Village employees and will receive its second reading. Ordinance 2023-57 is to establish the 2024 appropriations for expenses and will receive its second reading. Mayor Bordenkircher will address the final two pieces of legislation. Bills were passed around for approval.

Police: No report.

Solicitor: Village Solicitor, Joel Blue, had nothing to report.

Village Administrator: Village Administrator Tammy Hicks reported that leaf pickup will be done on December 1, 2023. Residents may then bag the leaves and leave them on the curb strip for pick up. Sidewalks on Russel Ave. from Johnson Ave. through Oak will be completed before Christmas. The remaining sidewalks East of Fair St. will be completed in the Spring. The Neighborhood Revitalization project is officially completed. The playground was installed last Monday and will be available for use soon after the concrete sets. Work is being done on the new website and should be done by the end of the year. A Building and Property committee meeting was requested to discuss updating the Building Permit document.

Community Relations: Chairwoman Brittany Howell reported the Chamber Christmas parade in the Village will be Saturday, December 2nd at Noon.

Fire Dependency Board: Chairwoman Christie Maurer reported meeting this evening at 5:30 and set up the committee for 2024. The citizen is Martin Glazier, Glenn Hill the chairman and Christie Maurer is the Secretary.

Ordinance: Chairman Bo Fortune had nothing to report regarding committee meetings. Fortune addressed Council with a timeline of progression for the Photo Traffic Enforcement System ordinance being presented. On October 19, 2023 a Public Safety committee met and was advised of the school zone speeding issues and the proposal to use the traffic system and there were no objections from the committee. Next, it was presented to the Ordinance committee and there were no objections from the committee. It was then run past the Village Solicitor, Joel Blue, and he presented it to the County Prosecutor and was given a green light to move forward. There has been 39 days lapse since it was first brought before the committees and by the time the legislation is passed, it will have been 60 days since it was first brought to Council. Fortune questioned Council members if any of them feel it is being rushed through. He also asked Council if any of them feel that the safety of the school children does not need to be addressed. No comments were made or any further discussion.

Planning Commission: Rich Wheeler reported on the Regional Planning Commission to say that they did meet, but they did not have a quorum. They did discuss going from a Regional Planning Commission to a County Planning Commission because it would require fewer people to be present.
